BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the purpose of the Regular Meetings shall be the normal conduct of business of the Board of Education and any other items brought to the Board's attention by the Board Members, Board Attorney, Superintendent and Business Administrator/Board Secretary;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education does hereby designate the Hunterdon Democrat, Hunterdon Review and The Express-Times as official newspapers to receive notices of meetings;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby approves that notices of meetings of the Board of Education will be posted in the Clinton Township Board of Education Administration Office, each Clinton Township School, posted on the District website and filed with the Clerk of Clinton Township;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education reserves the right to adjourn or recess a meeting at any time to discuss such matters that may be considered in closed session. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any funds on deposit in Board of Education accounts be subject to withdrawal at any time upon presentation of warrants, checks, notes, bonds, bond coupons or other instruments or orders for the payment of money when signed, live or facsimile;

y. Appointment of District Certified Purchasing Agent

WHEREAS, 18A:18A-2 provides that a board of education shall assign the authority, responsibility and accountability for the purchasing activity of the board of education to a person or persons who shall have the power to prepare advertisements, to advertise for and receive bids and to award contracts as permitted by this chapter; and

WHEREAS 18A:18A-3 provides that contracts, awarded by the purchasing agent that do not exceed in the aggregate in a contract year the bid threshold (Currently \$36,000), may be awarded by the purchasing agent without advertising for bids when so authorized by board resolution; and

WHEREAS 18A:18A-37,c. provides that all contracts that are in the aggregate less than 15% of the bid threshold (Currently \$5,400) may be awarded by the purchasing agent without soliciting competitive quotations if so authorized by board resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Clinton Township Board of Education, pursuant to the statutes cited above hereby appoints Anthony Juskiewicz, as its duly authorized purchasing agent and is duly assigned the authority, responsibility and accountability for the purchasing activity of the Clinton Township Board of Education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Anthony Juskiewicz is hereby authorized to award contracts on behalf of the Clinton Township Board of Education that are in the aggregate less than 15% of the bid threshold (Currently \$5,400) without soliciting competitive quotations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Anthony Juskiewicz is hereby authorized to seek competitive quotations, when applicable and practicable and award contracts on behalf of the Clinton Township Board of Education when contracts in the aggregate exceed 15% of the bid threshold (Currently \$5,400) but are less than the bid threshold of \$36,000.

- *Description of pupil progress, including grade level, according to evaluation system used by the district;*
- *History and status of physical health per state regulations;*
- *Special education records pursuant to relevant rules and laws;*
- *All other records required by the New Jersey State Board of Education.*

COMMITTEE REPORTS

KINDERGARTEN AD-HOC:

Rachel McLaughlin - Chair; Kevin Maloy

Presentation - Full Day Kindergarten

Mrs. McLaughlin in conjunction with Dr. Clark and Mrs. VanBelle presented the findings of the Kindergarten Ad-Hoc committee.

SECOND RECOGNITION OF THE PUBLIC

- Mrs. Domagalski stated that she is a parent of a 3rd grader and a 2½ year old and that she supports full day kindergarten, but questioned how it may affect the school choice numbers.
- Mrs. Ford, spoke in support of full day kindergarten as it helps maintain property values.
- Mr. Ruttenburg, CTEA Member, expressed concerns about social interaction within a group and he feels 60 minutes is not enough time for interaction.
- Mrs. MacIsaac, favors full day kindergarten. She felt that not enough parents were involved in the process. She feels that children need more time reading. She also expressed concerns whether the 3 week time frame is enough time for the Board to make a decision.
- Mrs. Brennan, expressed concerns that the Board is behind the times with full day kindergarten and the Board needs to support this notion, since kids come first. She requested that the Board look at this in two ways, not just financially.
- Mrs. Barone, parent of a preschooler and 3rd grader supports full day kindergarten and questioned if the district does not pay for full day kindergarten now how much will it cost later?
- Mrs. Olawski, supports full day kindergarten. She spoke about her daughter's struggles with learning and needs extra help, she expressed concerns with kids struggling with the common core and added stress.
- Mrs. Lawn, feels that full day kindergarten would help in the transition to 1st grade. Her daughter, now in 3rd grade, would have been a better student if there was a full day program.
- Mrs. Yoder, thanked the committee for the presentation, and supports full day kindergarten.
- Mrs. Wrba, feels that the common core has blind-sided students and they are not ready going forward. It is a different world from many years ago, she supports full day kindergarten.
- Mrs. Rechen, feels that the half day program puts students behind. She enrolled her child in the K-Wrap program to supplement the afternoon kindergarten program. She feels that students need to be prepared going forward, and supports full day program.

- Mr. Gray, feels that a \$20 per year differential in taxes is a no brainer for not choosing full day kindergarten. He spoke in support of investing in the future of education.
- Matvi, supports full day kindergarten, spoke about parent sending kids to half day program and spending additional money on daycare or another program. This program supports the whole community.
- Mrs. Passafaro, commented that PARCC and the common core are taking education to a different level, full day kindergarten is needed to give each child the opportunity to learn.
- Mrs. Lorcheim, supports full day kindergarten. She stated that the increase in taxes would be worth the money since more is paid for additional programs or daycare, this would affect young families in the community.

Dr. Clark concluded the session with her closing remarks.


