A Boy Scout who attains this rank is called an Eagle Scout or Eagle. Since the introduction of the Eagle Scout Award in 1911, over more than two million Boy Scouts earned the rank of **Eagle Scout**. That number seems to represent a large number of boys, but only four percent of all Boys Scouts ever reach this milestone.

The journey to earning your Eagle Scout Award is long, filled with hard work, many hours, and if a Boy Scout wants to earn his Eagle Scout Award, he must be fully dedicated to doing so.

Requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges and demonstrating Scout Spirit through the Boy Scout Oath and Law, service, and leadership. This includes an extensive service project that the Scout plans, organizes, leads, and manages.

This evening, we are very lucky to have in attendance with us – Satvik Vyakaranam from Boy Scout Troop 156. He recently achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. Satvik would you please join me at the podium?

One of the last tasks that a Boy Scout must complete to earn, and become an Eagle Scout is to complete a large community project that benefits someone, something or an organization. Satvik selected the Clinton Township School District, and more specifically, a location at the Round Valley School to complete his project. He crafted a beautiful map of the United States on the playground at Round Valley School.

The planning and preparation included written proposals, meeting with building administration, approval with his troop leader before approval from the Board of Education. Satvik gathered 13 volunteers to help him complete the project. This totaled over 150 volunteer hours.

In July, he started acquiring materials to complete the work and he also raised \$500 for the cost of materials. The actual labor portion of his work began on August 24 and was completed on August 31st. Work on the project was delayed, on many occasions, as a result of the crazy weather that we experienced during the month of August. However, with some great perseverance and dedication to the project, Setvik worked through these challenges and completed this beautiful project!
