Christine Ladato, CTEA President, spoke about a fair settlement in the collective bargaining process. She stated that the CTEA has encountered repeated cancellations and delays from the Board, and she expressed the desire on the part of the CTEA to move the process forward. She expressed concern that the Board had requested of its professional negotiator, Mr. Phillip Stern, to solely represent the Board during the process.

Chuck Roberta, CTEA Officer, expressed that the CTEA takes great pride in what they do.

Mr. Skirbst, Field Representative for the NJEA, provided comments that three sections of code associated with ethics that have been violated in conjunction with item 18-PN-165 on the agenda and grievances were filed.

Karen Smith expressed her concern with the elimination of the position of Executive Secretary to the Superintendent. She inquired about who would update the school calendar. She suggested moving Mrs. Bobal to the Round Valley School. She stated that Mrs. Guenther has done a good job at Spruce Run School. She completed her comments by asking the Board to reconsider item 18-PN-165.

Chuck Roberta, CTEA Officer, thanked the Board for issuing the 2018-2019 school calendar and noticed a discrepancy in the number of student days which added to 183, and not 184.

Nicole Fava, CTMS Teacher, asked for a fair wage for a fair day's work. She expressed positive features about each of the Clinton Township Schools. She concluded by stating that "not to pay a fair wage for fair work is akin to losing a brick in the wall."

Faith Furman, Spruce Run School Nurse, addressed agenda item 18-PN-165. She stated the Mrs. Guenther is always handling details. She said that secretaries are there to free up the duties of the administration, and stated that an additional administrator was hired to free up administrators to do their work She concluded her remarks by asking what benefit it is if you take away secretaries in the middle of the year?

Lana Brennan inquired action item 18-PN-165 and expressed concern whether the district was putting itself in an inefficient position. She concluded by stating that she is looking forward to resolving the issue.

Rainy Dul, Preschool Teacher at Spruce Run School, expressed her concern with item 18-PN-165. She stated that she worked with Mrs. Bobal and both ladies in the motion do an excellent job. Both ladies were informed about an involuntary transfer without warning. The new Superintendent will be without a secretary and there would be a void created. She stated that there was much fear after the Sandy Hook issue and Annette Guenther assisted in putting together a safety plan. Mrs. Dul said Mrs. Guenther did a great job after there was a gas leak when Mrs. Goad wasn't in the building. Mrs. Guenther made us feel safe. She concluded by asking the Board to think hard about moving Mrs. Guenther.
